## What happens if a child or member of staff is diagnosed with Covid-19?

- 1. If a child or adult in the school is diagnosed with Covid-19, the HSE contact tracing process will be started.
- 2. Contact tracing is used to identify children or staff who were in close contact with someone who has coronavirus.
- 3. A close contact is defined by the HSE as someone who has spent more that 15 minutes of face-to-face contact within 2 metres of an infected person in any setting. The HSE will decide who is a close contact based on information provided by the school.
- 4. The school has a list of all the pupils and their parents' mobile numbers ready for sharing with the HSE if there is a confirmed case of Covid-19 in any classroom. This will be done in the strictest confidence.
- 5. If there is a confirmed case, the HSE will contact the school and will also contact the parents/guardians directly. This will be done by phone.
- 6. The HSE will arrange a test for any close contacts and advise you to restrict your movements.
- 7. The HSE will also send a letter through the school to all other parents/guardians in the school. No individual with a confirmed diagnosis of Covid-19 will be identified to any other person.
- 8. The school will remain open unless there is clear public health advise that it should close.
- 9. St. Conaire's NS will follow the advice of the Chief Medical Officer who stated on March 10<sup>th</sup> that "Public health authorities will contact schools if there is any action to be taken in relation to your school and students. You should not take any unilateral action."
